were integral members of the historic, Ridgely Methodist Episcopal Church, and served as trustees for Highland Park School, a Rosenwald School for African American students in Landover.




Robert Harrod Sr. was born in 1851, nine years prior to the start of the American Civil War, attended and was buried at the Ridgely Church Cemetery.



His son, Robert Harrod Jr,., married Eliza Queen and served as a trustee for the Highland Park Rosenwald School.




Marion "Dee" Harrod Reeder, the grandaugter of Robert Harrod Jr., offically joined Ridgely Church in June 1966.


